The Latinx Organizational Archives (LXOA) Project centers Latinx communities across the United States, takes seriously the “X” in Latinx by dedicating theoretical and empirical attention to *intra*-group inequalities, moves the scope of analysis from mass-level behavior to organizational-level behavior, and goes above and beyond current political science standards to create replicable data to also archive the work of organizations and thereby create more accurate and accessible accounts about the political lives, collective action, and influence of Latinos across the United States. Knowing that students are capable knowledge producers, this research was developed with cohorts of undergraduate and graduate student researchers at Arizona State University from Spring 2022 to Summer 2024. Knowing that community-based leaders and advocates have political and policy *expertise* our research team worked with three movement organizers, community advocates, and capacity builders to shape all facets of our social science project – from developing an ethical data collection protocol to developing a communication of results plan that is accessible to academics and publics alike. Ultimately, our research is of higher quality in terms of ethics, rigor, and utility.
